1. Purpose

The purpose of this instruction is to prevent the services provided to WARWICK HOTEL ANKARA guests from directly or indirectly facilitating the exploitation of wildlife.

2. Scope

It covers all direct or indirect services offered to guests within WARWICK HOTEL.

3. Application

, makes a conscious decision not to contribute to the extinction of wildlife. No activity that exploits or harms animals, either in the wild or in captivity, is encouraged. Service and activity providers are periodically evaluated and only those that ensure the welfare of wildlife are worked with.

This Wildlife Policy serves as a fixed principle for WARWICK HOTEL and is always taken into account in the evaluation of wildlife tourism providers.

Fundamental aspects of animal welfare are internationally recognised, which affirms the right of every living being to be treated humanely. The Five Freedoms are accepted standards of care:

(i) Freedom from hunger and thirst through easy access to fresh water and a diet that will maintain full vitality and vigour.

(ii) Relief from discomfort by providing a nurturing environment including suitable shelter and comfortable resting area

(iii) Pain relief by providing mental health checks and rapid diagnosis and treatment of injuries and illnesses.
protection from injury or illness

(iv) Ensuring normal behaviour by providing adequate space, appropriate facilities and companionship of animals of their own kind.
freedom of expression

(v) Freedom from fear and distress by ensuring that living conditions and treatment are free from mental suffering.

Adopting the five freedoms supports the health and well-being of animals in captivity and in the wild.

This ensures that animals are treated humanely, free from unpleasant situations.

Captive Animals

While WARWICK HOTEL believes that animals belong in the wild, we also understand that due to habitat loss, over-poaching and domestication of animals, captive animals represent a large portion of wildlife tourism. Types of captive animal facilities include urban zoos, rural safari parks, aviaries, aviaries, beasts of prey and snakes, riding stables, elephant camps,

dolphins, public animal shelters, public rescue and rehabilitation centers, circuses,

There are individual animals kept for display or performance purposes.
